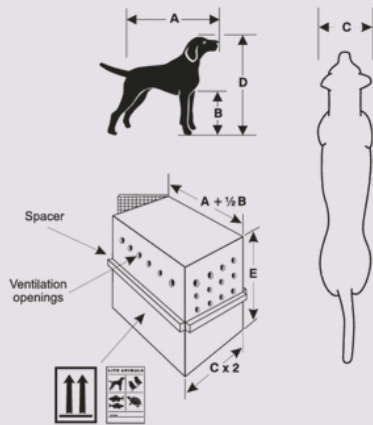


TRAVEL KENNEL CHECKLIST



MEASURE YOUR PET

- Your pet must be able to stand, sit, lie down & spin around comfortably inside the kennel.
- Measure your pet's
 - A (length) - from tip of nose to base of tail
 - B (elbow length) - from elbow to floor
 - C (width) - at shoulders or widest point
 - D (height) - from tip of ears to floor

KENNEL REQUIREMENTS

- Smooth interior - nothing sharp
- All openings nose & paw proof
- Ventilation on two sides, back, & door
- Ventilation holes cannot be larger than 25 mm x 25 mm for dogs and 19 mm x 19 mm for cats
- Must be made of fiberglass, metal, rigid plastics, welded wire mesh, solid wood or plywood
- Top & bottom must be secured by metal nuts & bolts
- Door should be reinforced with cable ties while pet is in transit
- Ventilation holes on the sides & back must be over the upper $\frac{2}{3}$ of the kennel (NOT on the bottom)
- Absorbent bedding can be in the kennel but must not be more than 3 inches thick (ex. crate pad, pee pads, thin t-shirt, blanket or towel)
- Food & water bowls must attach to the inside of the kennel door so they can be filled from the outside

SIZE

The minimum internal container dimensions should be calculated as follows:

- Length = $A + \frac{1}{2} B$
- Width = $C \times 2$
- Height = $D + \text{bedding}$

Snub-nosed breeds require a 10% larger kennel.

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED

- Wheels
- Wire crates
- Clips or twist locks without nuts & bolts to reinforce the top & bottom
- Litter boxes/litter
- Luggage
- Bedding more than 3 inches thick
- Toys, bones, clothing, or other personal belongings
- Unapproved medications

OTHER NOTES

- You should NEVER sedate your pet for air travel.
- GPS trackers are not permitted unless they are declared in advance and comply with IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations.
